

## **Taking UC's Foreign Language Placement Test (FLPT)**

(Please note that there is a specific procedure for waiver of French, German or Spanish – see below)

Students are typically placed into language courses depending upon their years of study in high school or prior level of completion in college. The FLPT is used in certain individual cases as an additional placement tool by the Language Coordinator.

### **TAKING THE FLPT**

Students can take the FLPT in person in the Language Resource Center (612 Old Chem) by appointment (513-556-1926). On the day of the test, students should bring their UC ID and enough credit on their Bearcat card to print out their score. After they show their ID, students will take the exam, print out the results, and have them stamped by the language lab. Students then present these results to the appropriate Language Coordinator.

## **Taking UC's Foreign Language Placement Test (FLPT) for Waiver of Spanish, French or German Language Requirement**

Students are typically placed into language courses depending upon their years of study in high school or prior level of completion in college. However, students who have extensive prior study in Spanish, French or German may apply for a waiver of the College language requirement with a minimum score of 500 on the Foreign Language Placement Test (FLPT).

### **TAKING THE FLPT**

Students intending to place out of the College language requirement for Spanish, French or German must score 500 or better on the placement test taken in the Language Resource Center (612 Old Chem). Students should first call (513-556-1926) to make an appointment. The day of the test, they should bring their UC ID and enough credit on their Bearcat card to print out their score in the language lab. After they show their ID, students will take the exam, print out the results, and have them stamped by the language lab.

### **AFTER TAKING THE FLPT**

Students who score a 500 or above should then take their stamped placement score to the appropriate Undergraduate Director (For French and Spanish, Professor Fenfang Hwu, 710B Old Chem and for German, Professor Jennifer Kelley-Thierman, 742Old Chem). The Undergraduate Director will certify the language requirement waiver to the McMicken College of Arts and Sciences Undergraduate Affairs and Advising Office, where it will be processed. Students in other UC Colleges should take their stamped placement score to their College office for waiver of the language requirement.
